After a long battle with multiple myeloma, Terry Lampton was victorious in the Lord on August 6 this summer. Terry passionately served as President and Vice-President of LMAC for many years. His service and devotion to LMAC served as an example to all and he will be greatly missed.

Terry was a member of Concordia Lutheran Church. He and Ellen Jenicek were blessed with 49 years of marriage. Their daughter Erinn lives in Layton, UT with her husband Aaron Schrader while son, Neil and wife, Lesia, reside in Falls Church, VA. Terry enjoyed time spent with family and treasured his 5 grandchildren.

Terry, after honorably serving in the Army, worked 38 years in Civil Service for the

government. He enjoyed traveling, cheering on the University of Kentucky and bass fishing. He was a lifelong Lutheran with a passion for sharing the gospel with all he met. A very active member of Concordia, he served as Chairman of the Stewardship Committee, was President of the Elders and participated in the church's outreach to people with disabilities.

Terry also was a committed supporter of the mission of LMAC. Terry enjoyed and valued the Lutheran community and spear headed the screening of The Luther Movie for the Lutheran community as part of our 500th Reformation Anniversary celebrations.

Lutheran Community Outreach Center (LCOC). He was a strong supporter of the Lutheran Community Food Bank housed in the LCOC. The food bank feeds spiritual as well as physical needs of our neighbors. A pastor from one

of the circuits leads Bible Study from 8:45-9:15 am before the food distribution begins at 9:30 on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of each month. 25-30 people regularly attend the Bible Study. There is an average of 304 families (1156 individuals) who receive food each month. Each individual receives food for 12 meals totaling 12,872 meals/ month.

Terry, with Neil's help, created and maintained the LMAC website, Imacevansville.org, which exists to share information about LMAC and our member churches with visitors to the site and our Lutheran community. The history of LMAC from its beginning in 1928 is available on the website.
